Methodist Mansfield became home to the first Tarrant County satellite campus for the nursing school at Texas Tech University, a nationally accredited school with a highly regarded reputation for nursing excellence.

The school features nearly 5,000 square feet of instructional space, including two classrooms, four exam rooms, three testing rooms, a nursing station, a reception area, a lounge, six staff offices, and clinical teaching space. The new facility will help address the shortage of nurses in the Dallas-Fort Worth area, and students are able to complete their training and clinical rotations working side by side with our nurses at multiple Methodist facilities.

MURALS PROMOTE COMMUNITY SPIRIT

Methodist Mansfield commissioned three colorful murals to adorn the sides of Downtown Mansfield buildings as a way to support the arts and show appreciation for the community.

The murals, painted by artists Jerod "D'TOX," Eddie Phillips, and Mary Phillips, include creative depictions of the city's transformation over the years and people riding bikes and playing sports. There's even an interactive component where visitors can have their photos taken in front of a set of multicolored wings bent in the shape of a heart.

HELPING PROTECT YOUNG ATHLETES AND EDUCATORS

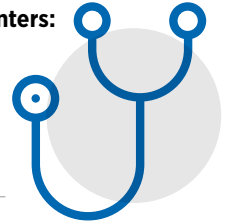

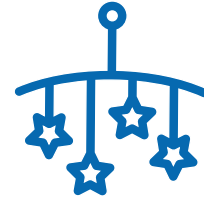

METHODIST MANSFIELD MARKS 15TH ANNIVERSARY WITH FLASHY FLAIR

In December, Methodist Mansfield celebrated 15 years in the community with a colorful drone light show — the first ever in the city of Mansfield. Fifty drones illuminated the night sky, flying above the hospital and forming different shapes in perfect synchronization.

Even from miles away, spectators could see the colorful patterns of a cross, the number 15, and other images meaningful to Methodist Mansfield.
