Record year for annual Gala

The Methodist Richardson Medical Center Foundation's sixth annual Yellow and Black Tie Gala raised a record \$326,000 to benefit the nationally accredited Methodist Richardson Cancer Center.

At the event, the Foundation's second annual Legacy Award was presented to longtime Richardson residents Jim and Rhonda Hoyt, owners of Richardson Bike Mart, for the difference they've made in the Richardson community.

At Methodist Richardson Medical Center, our mission is to improve and save lives through compassionate, quality health care. So in 2012, we embarked on some new, exciting pathways toward further achieving this goal.

\$120 million hospital expansion

We broke ground on a new 125-bed, four-story acute care hospital on the Bush/Renner campus. The Campbell Road campus will undergo a renovation and continue to offer a variety of services, including the addition of post-acute care and rehabilitation services.

Single-Site™ technology

With the robotic da Vinci[®] Surgical System, surgeons can now perform gallbladder removal through a single incision, resulting in minimal pain and scarring.

Wound Care and Hyperbaric Center

The center offers specialized outpatient care, including hyperbaric oxygen therapy, for patients with chronic, nonhealing wounds.

Methodist Patient-Centered ACO

Methodist's accountable care organization (ACO) was one of 89 in the nation — and the only in Dallas–Fort Worth — selected in 2012 to participate in the federal Medicare Shared Savings Program.

These initiatives are making a difference in Richardson and the surrounding communities

- **Methodist Generations.** Formerly called Platinum Plus, this organization adopted a new name in 2012 to more accurately reflect its broad range of participants (age 55 and older). The program offers a variety of wellness activities, social events, and education outreach throughout the year.
- Mobile mammography unit. In partnership with Susan G. Komen for the Cure, Methodist made breast cancer screening more convenient for 3,733 women, including 536 in the Methodist Richardson service area, in 2012.
- Prostate Screening and Awareness Program. This free service provided more than 5,700 prostate cancer screenings in our communities this year (412 in the Methodist Richardson service area) and provides more screenings than any other hospital-based program in the nation.
- Asian Breast Health Outreach Project. Last year, this program provided 1,772 mammogram screenings, 221 diagnostic exams, and 35 biopsies, as well as breast health education to uninsured and underinsured Asian women.
